REVIEW

Adelaide's JPE Design Studio is Australia's oldest architecture firm and marks its 160th anniversary with a retrospective exhibition of its designs. The exhibition, open to the public, is a visual essay of JPE's work through the decades which has included iconic buildings such as Adelaide Railway Station designed in 1925.

"When it was designed it was Australia's grandest railway station, it was modelled on New York's Grand Central Terminal and was built as an impressive entrance to the city," JPE Design Studio's current director Adrian Evans says.

Other JPE projects have included Charles Moore Department store in Victoria Square (now Sir Samuel Way Law Courts Building), hotels such as The Stag, Maid and Magpie and the Elephant and Castle and the more recent, sustainable office developments, The Edge and The Wave.

Designing Place in South Australia – a retrospective exhibition is at The Wave, Level 4/ 19 Gilles St, Adelaide, until December 23.
